

The lake will be lowered this year, commencing on September 15 and replacement of the spillway boards will begin November 30, 2014.

Here is the anticipated schedule:

1. Planned Start Drop (dam boards removal starting) (Weekend of 9/14)
2. Planned Lowest Level Reached (lowest level - 20" below full height) (10/5)
3. Planned Start Rise (dam boards back in) (11/30)

If you are a lakefront homeowner and plan to do any repairs to your dock or wall, your project must receive written approval from the CLPO in addition to obtaining the appropriate permits from Denville Township and/or NJDEP. Please submit your request to the Board Secretary, 91 Cedar Lake E. or email [CLPO@optonline.net](mailto:CLPO@optonline.net) so that arrangements can be made for a review of the project.

**Please be advised that the NJDEP, through NJAC 7:7A (the Freshwater Wetland Act Rules) and NJAC 7:13 (the Flood Area Control Act Rules), governs work done within State Open Waters, Wetlands, Wetland Transition Areas, Floodplains and the Riparian areas associated with Floodplains. As such, those contemplating any work pertaining to the construction or expansion of a bulkhead or seawall (regardless of the material used), dredging, the placement of fill within the lake or in wetlands, wetlands clearing, or the construction of dock or pier, are advised that NJDEP permit(s) may be required. Failure to obtain said permits could result in significant fines and mitigation for the resulting wetland, floodplain or open water impact. You are therefore advised to consult with an engineer or environmental professional before engaging in any such work. Therefore please plan accordingly and make sure that you file for the required permits well in advance of implementing any work that could trigger the need for a permit.**
